Secrets For Great Singing!

Sing the words of a song on vowels only. Keep the tone rich and connected even though you're changing the shape of your mouth. Tone rides on the vowels.

Expression rides on the consonants. Every word has a beginning, a middle, and an end. Did you say, "luf isa one urful thin?" Now, say it again: "LoVe is a WoNDerful thinG!"

When a word has a diphthong or ends with an R, wait until the very end before you turn the diphthong or pronounce the R. "Hour" = Ah.....were "Night" = Nah.....eet "I'II" = Ah.....ihl

Every musical or lyrical phrase has a beginning, a middle, and an end. Keep the energy alive with articulation and dynamics.

Keep the message alive by breathing in places that don't interrupt the meaning of the phrase.

Keep the audience enraptured by showing them how you feel about the meaning of the song and how much you love singing it.
